Lead XX A/C 7114-L Douglas-Simeral engine caught fire. A/C abandoned and crashed in County of Sussex. Personnel parachuted to safety.

Bombardier Lt. Max Ralthel of A/C 2600-Z Dep Leader Rice-Baker now became Lead Bombardier for the Lead Group (PDF 0738, item 3). No data could be found that Rice-Baker in A/C 2600-Z in original Deputy Lead position in Lead Group actually moved to lead of lead element Lead Group. However, it is highly likely that Rice Baker would move to leader since they were Deputy Leader on assembly and the lead position vacant. Also checked whether Alhadeff in 7249-F moved to lead element. No evidence that he moved. Thus the chart was drawn as is, but it is most likely Rice-Baker moved up to lead position.

Primary and secondary target completely covered. No bombs dropped (PDF 0722).
